What is the Idaho Parental Choice Tax Credit Program?

- Enacted in 2025 and provides nearly \$50 million in state funds
- Funds Parental Choice tax credit and advance payment
- For full-time Idaho residents
- Pays for qualifying nonpublic-school expenses for:
 - K-12 students
 - Students up to 21 years old with qualifying disability who require ancillary personnel



Idaho Parental Choice Tax Credit Program

- Refundable tax credit
- Allows parents to apply for tax credit of:
 - Up to \$5,000 for each eligible student
 - Up to \$7,500 for each eligible student with a qualifying disability

Idaho Parental Choice Tax Credit Program

- This program requires that parents with modified adjusted income not exceeding 300% of federal poverty level must get priority
- We're using <u>2024 federal poverty level</u> numbers this application season
- Applications will be reviewed on first-come, first-served basis
- No one guaranteed to get it



Preparing To Apply for Credit or Advance Payment

- Carefully read all FAQs to ensure you and your potential expenses qualify.
- 1. By **Nov. 1, 2025**, ensure you've filed 2024 Form 40, Idaho Individual Income Tax Return
- 2. By **Dec. 1, 2025**, register for a TAP account: tax.idaho.gov/NewTAP
- 3. Start saving receipts for qualifying expenses

Submitting application doesn't guarantee you'll get credit or advance payment



Is this a Voucher Program?

No. Credit or advance payment goes to parent, guardian, or foster parent.

What's the Timeline?

- By Nov. 1, 2025: File a 2024 Idaho Form 40
- By Dec. 1, 2025: Register for TAP account
- Jan. 15, 2026: First day you can apply for the credit and advance payment
- Mar. 15, 2026: Last day to apply for the credit and advance payment
- Apr. 15, 2026: We'll notify parents of awards
- To be determined: We might reopen the application process if any funds remain.



Do We Have to be Idaho Residents?

- Yes
- Parents and children must be full-time Idaho residents
- Parent must have filed 2024 Form 40, Idaho Individual Income Tax Return, that lists children as dependents



What are Qualified Expenses?

- Can include costs for eligible student's nonpublic academic instruction in core subjects of English language arts, mathematics, science, social studies
- Purchases must be:
 - Directly related to the education of the eligible student
 - Reasonable and necessary for requirements of academic instruction



What are Qualified Expenses?

Examples that might qualify

- School tuition or fees
- Curriculum including core subjects, at minimum
- Textbooks
- Tutoring
- Courses associated with nationally standardized assessments
- Transportation

Examples that won't qualify

- Expenses for anyone except eligible students
- Vacations
- Big-screen televisions
- Gaming computers
- Vehicles
- Entertainment



Homeschooling and Qualified Expenses

- Could qualify: Materials such as textbooks and curricula
- Won't qualify: Fee for instruction a parent provides

Tracking Expenses for Application

Keep receipts for expenses paid in 2025:

To your nonpublic school

Incurred for homeschool instruction

Nonpublic Schools Without Required Core Subjects

To qualify for tax credit, academic instruction for eligible students must include the core subjects of **English language arts**, **mathematics**, **science**, **and social studies**, at a minimum

What if Nonpublic School Isn't Accredited?

You must document student's growth using a portfolio of evidence or learning record



What if My Expenses Don't Qualify?

- Must produce receipts of qualifying expenses
- Can't get tax credit if you don't show qualifying expenses

What if My Expenses Don't Qualify?

- Must repay funds spent outside provisions of the law. Financial penalty and interest might apply.
- Providing false information when applying is tax fraud. Civil and criminal penalties – up to felony charges – might apply.

Is My School Nonpublic?

- Nonpublic is a private school, microschool, or learning pod that provides academic instruction to eligible students
- Can be in person, online, virtually, or a combination
- Charges tuition while a public school doesn't
 - Example: Idaho Home Learning Academy or Idaho Virtual Academy don't qualify

Using Public School Amenities

- If your student is enrolled in any public school for academic instruction, you can't claim the credit for that semester.
- Students can't be enrolled:
 - Full time or part time in public school, public charter school, public virtual charter school, or public magnet school
 - Part-time kindergarten



Why Do I Have to File an Idaho Tax Return?



We use it to:


- Create an individual tax account for you in our system if this is your first time filing in Idaho.
- Determine if your income exceeds 300% of the federal poverty level.
- If this is your first time filing, it will allow you to register for a TAP account.

What if I Didn't Have To File in 2024?

- Must file an Idaho Form 40 anyway
 - We've provided these special filing instructions. (FAQ #7)
- File ASAP to allow time for processing




Where Do I Get Form 40?

Is There a Limit to How Many Kids in my Family Can Qualify?

- There's no limit to number of your children you can apply for
- Apply for all your eligible children on one application

Can Nonpublic School Be Out of State?

- Yes, if school meets the law's requirements
- If nonpublic school isn't accredited, you must document student's growth using a portfolio of evidence or learning record

Do Empowering Parents Grant Funds Qualify for This Program?

No. You can't claim the credit or advance payment for items bought with the Empowering Parents grant.






