NOTICE OF CREATION OF DISTRICT

Upon order of the Oneida County Commissioners and by due process of law, a special election was held on September 2, 1975 with polling places at Holbrook and Malad. The purpose of the election in response to petition was to create a Weather Modification District. The bounds of said district to be the entire county of Oneida.

Upon canvass of the ballots it was found that the vote was as follows;

5 - Description of lands to be included in the proposed district:

The proposed district would include all land located in Oneida County, Idaho which is legally described in Idaho Code 31-133 as follows:

31-133. Oneida county. -Oneida county is described as follows:

beginning at a point where the one hundred thirteenth (113th) meridian west from Greenwich intersects with the southern line of township twelve (12) south;

Western boundary. Thence south along the said meridian to a point where said meridian intersects with the northern boundary line of the state of Utah (R. C., S23s);

Southern boundary. Thence easterly along said boundary line to a point on the boundary line between the states of Utah and Idaho, where the same intersected by the section line between sections twenty-six (26) and twenty-seven (27), township sixteen (16) south, range thirty-seven (37) east;

Eastern boundary. Thence in a northerly direction along the section line as now surveyed to the southeast corner of section twenty-seven (27), township fourteen (14) south, range thirty-seven (37) east; thence easterly along said section line as now surveyed to the southeast corner of section twenty-six (26) township fourteen (14) south range thirty-seven (37) east; thence continuing easterly along said line to a point which, when surveyed, will be the southeast corner of section twenty-five (25), township fourteen (14) south, range thirty-seven (37) east; thence northerly along the western boundary of township fourteen (14) south, range thirty-eight (38) east, as now surveyed, to its intersection with the boundary line (1913, ch. 5, S2, pp. 22, 23) of Bannock county; thence west along the boundary line of Bannock county to a point on the top of the range west of a point one (1) mile south of the present southern boundary of the townsite of Oxford; thence northwesterly along the crest of the mountains be-

tween Malad and Marsh valleys an intersection of the township line between ranges thirty-six (36) and thirty-seven (37) east, Boise meridian, thence north to the east quarter (E $\frac{1}{4}$) corner of section twenty-five (25), township twelve (12) south, range thirty-six (36) east, Boise meridian; thence west through the center of sections twenty-five (25), twenty-six (26), twenty-seven (27) and to the center of section twenty-eight (28); thence south on the north and south center line of sections twenty-eight (28) and thirty-three (33), township twelve (12) south, range thirty-six (36), east, Boise meridian, to the top of the crest of the mountains between Malad and Marsh valleys; thence northwesterly along the crest of the mountains between Malad and Marsh valleys to the southeast corner of section twenty-four (24), township eleven (11) south, range thirty-five (35) east, Boise meridian; thence following the unbroken crest of the main mountain range to the northwest corner of section twenty-three (23), township eleven (11) south, range thirty-five (35) east; thence north one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) mile, to the quarter corner between sections fourteen (14) and fifteen (15); thence west one (1) mile to the quarter corner of the sections fifteen (15) and sixteen (16); thence north one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) mile, to the northwest corner of section fifteen (15); thence west one-fourth ($\frac{1}{4}$) mile; thence north one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) mile; thence north one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) mile; thence west one-fourth ($\frac{1}{4}$) mile, to the northwest corner of section nine (9), township eleven (11) south, range thirty-five (35) east; thence north one (1) mile, to the northwest corner of section four (4), township eleven (11) south, range thirty-five (35) east, which is the point of intersection with the township line between townships ten (10) and eleven (11) south, range thirty-five (35) east; Northern boundary. Thence west along and upon the south line of said town-

ship ten (10), to a point on said line two (2) miles east from the southeast corner of township ten (10) south, range thirty-three (33) east (1913, ch. 6, S2, p. 32); thence south to a point where the line thus drawn intersects the line between townships eleven (11) and twelve (12) south, range thirty-four (34) east (1915, ch. 132, S2, p. 288); thence west along and upon the south line of said township eleven (11) south, to the southeast corner of township eleven (11) south, range thirty-two (32) east; thence south upon the township line to the southeast corner of township twelve (12) south, range thirty-two (32) east; thence west upon and along the southern line of said township twelve (12), to the place of beginning (1913, ch. 6, S2, p. 32) (Compiled and read. C. L. C. L. 3:35; C. S. 342; am. 1927, ch. 256, S 6, p. 431; I. C. A., S 30-136.)

6 - A map of the proposed district is available in the office of the Board of Oneida County Commissioners at the Courthouse, Malad, Idaho.

7 - Names and terms of the members to be elected to the first board of trustees:

The Oneida County Commissioners propose that the following individuals be elected to the first board of the trustees of the Weather Modification District.

a) One year member.

Name: Lyman Ipsen
Term: September 2, 1975 to the second Tuesday in January 1977.

b) Two year member.

Name: Max King
Term: September 2, 1975 to the second Tuesday in January 1978.

c) Three year member.

Name: David Bird
Term: September 2, 1975 to the second Tuesday in January 1979.

The electors have the choice of voting for one of the above individuals or writing in a candidate of their choice.

8 - Each elector shall cast his or her ballot which shall contain the words, "Oneida County Weather Modification District, Yes ()" or "Oneida County Weather Modification District, No ()". The elector shall also vote on the first members of the first board of trustees of the Oneida County Weather Modification District or write in their choice in the event those nominated by the Oneida County Commissioners are not acceptable.

The ballot will be as follows:

Three year trustee:

David Bird ()

9 - No person shall be entitled to vote at such election unless he shall possess all the qualifications required of electors under the general election laws of the State of Idaho and be a resident of the proposed district. However no previous registration shall be necessary for such election.

NOTICE OF ELECTION
TO FORM A WEATHER
MODIFICATION DISTRICT
AND ELECTION OF
BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Notice is hereby given that the Board of County Commissioners of Oneida County, State of Idaho, at a regular meeting on the 14th day of July, 1975, made an order to give Notice of an Election to form a Weather Modification District and Election of the First Board of Trustees for said Weather Modification District.

The Oneida County Commissioners have received a petition signed by Eighty (80) resident real property owners of Oneida County requesting that a Weather Modification District be formed pursuant to the Weather Modification Act enacted into law during the last session of the legislature and contained in Idaho Session Laws, Chapter 145, P. 334-336.

Pursuant to said Weather Modification Act the Oneida County Commissioners give Notice of Election as follows.

1 - Date And Hour Of Election:

The election shall be held on the 2nd day of September, 1975. The polls shall be open from 8:00 A.M. until 8:00 P.M. on September 2, 1975.

2 - Polling Places: There shall be two (2) polling places for the election; to-wit:

- L.D.S. Church
Holbrook Ward Chapel
Holbrook, Idaho
- American Legion Building
North Main Street
Malad, Idaho 83252

3 - Mill Levy: The maximum number of mills that could be levied for the District un-

der the present law is four (4) mills.

Four (4) mills levied on the property located in the proposed district based on 1974 property valuation would be \$38,082.44. The actual tax collected for the operation of the Weather Modification District would vary according to the property valuation for the year in question and the proposed budget for the district actually set by the Trustees and certified to the Board of Oneida County Commissioners.

4 - General Purposes of Proposed Weather Modification District:

- a) To promote, develop, and create water resources in Oneida County, Idaho.
- b) To investigate the possibility of decreasing hail and lightening in Oneida County, Idaho, by means of artificial nucleation or other means of weather modification.
- c) To coordinate or correlate the efforts of all residents, appropriate federal and state agencies, other weather modification districts, and owners of property in Oneida County, State of Idaho, in the matter of the development of additional water supplies and of the protection of water rights and water resources, for the benefit of the land & crops in the district.
- d) To exercise all the powers as provided in the Weather Modification Act passed by the Idaho Legislature in 1975 and contained in Idaho Sessions Laws Chapter 145, page 334 through 336.
