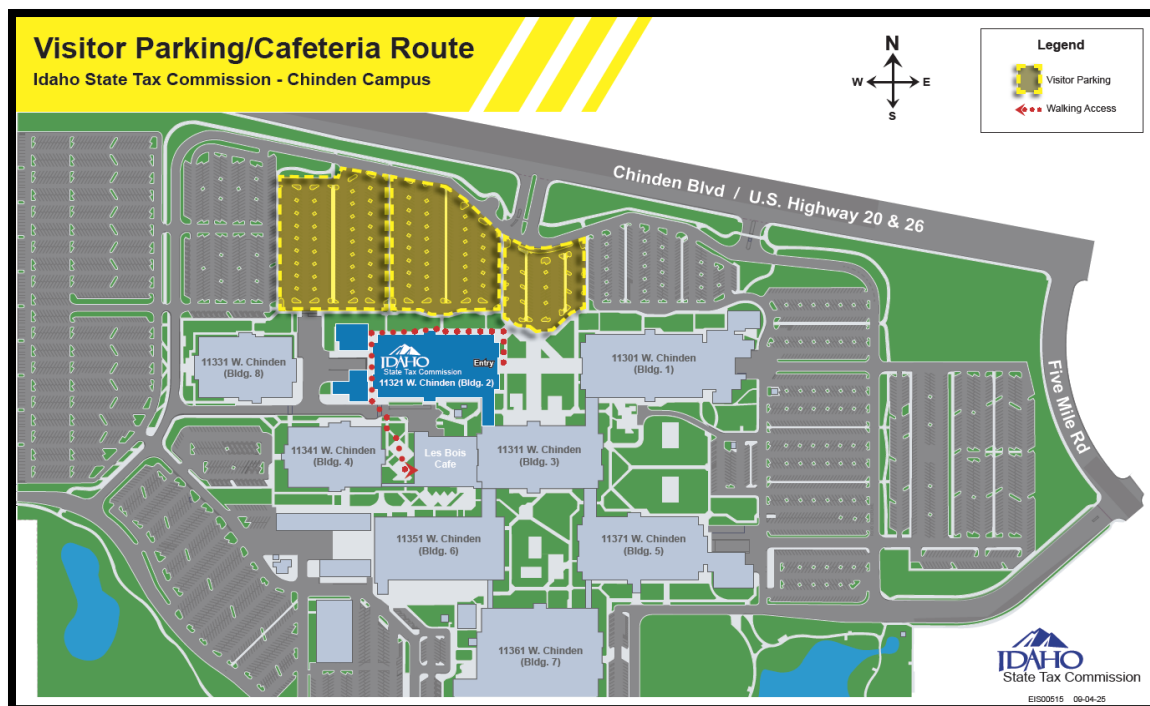
The Riverside Hotel has two restaurants. **There is no complimentary breakfast.**

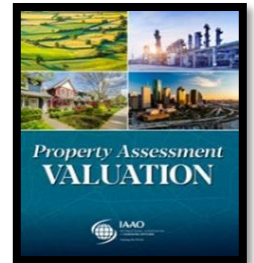
IAAO

IAAO Course 101: Fundamentals of Real Property Appraisal

This course provides students with an understanding and working knowledge of the procedures and techniques required to estimate the market value of vacant and improved properties. This course focuses on the skills you need to estimate the market value of properties using two approaches to value: the cost approach and the sales comparison approach.

This course includes an optional exam. The exam is required for Idaho students using the course to meet state certification requirements. Please confirm with your jurisdiction about any additional exam requirements. Note that if pursuing an IAAO designation, successfully passing the exam is required.

Successful completion of this course meets one of Idaho's three requirements for becoming a "Certified Property Tax Appraiser" for ad valorem appraisal.

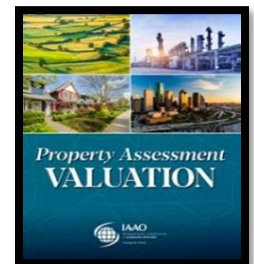

IAAO Course 102: Income Approach to Valuation

This course provides the student with an understanding and working knowledge of the procedures and techniques required to estimate the market value of vacant or improved properties by the income approach. The course covers real estate finance and investment, capitalization methods and techniques, analysis of income and expenses to estimate operating income, selection of capitalization rates, and application of the approach.

This course includes an optional exam. The exam is required for Idaho students using the course to meet state certification requirements. Please confirm with your jurisdiction about any exam requirements. If pursuing an IAAO designation, successfully passing the exam is required.

Successful completion of this course meets one of Idaho's three requirements for becoming a "Certified Property Tax Appraiser" for ad valorem appraisal.

Excel: Mass Appraisal Boot Camp

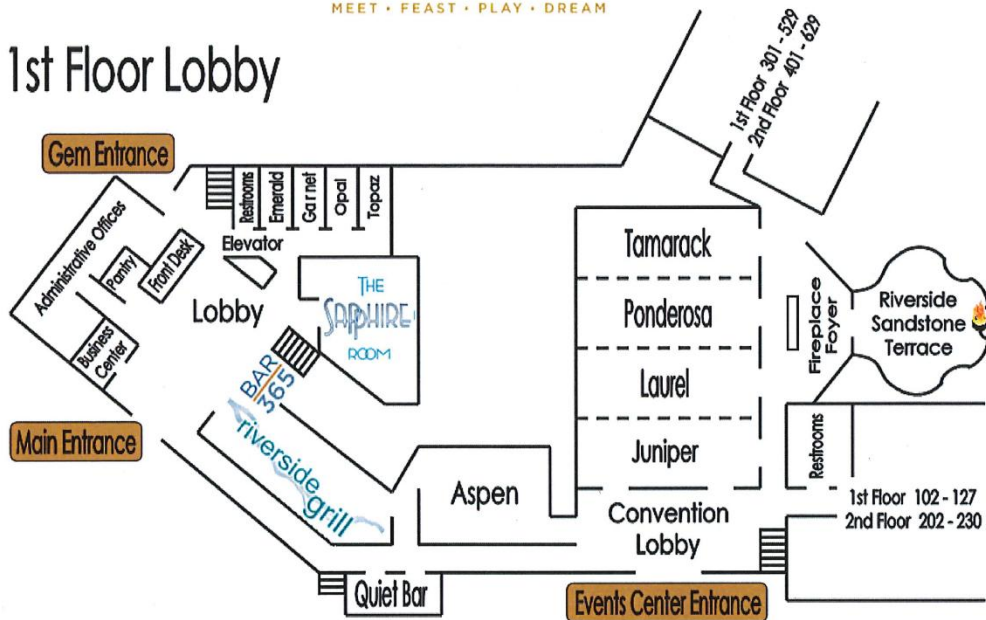

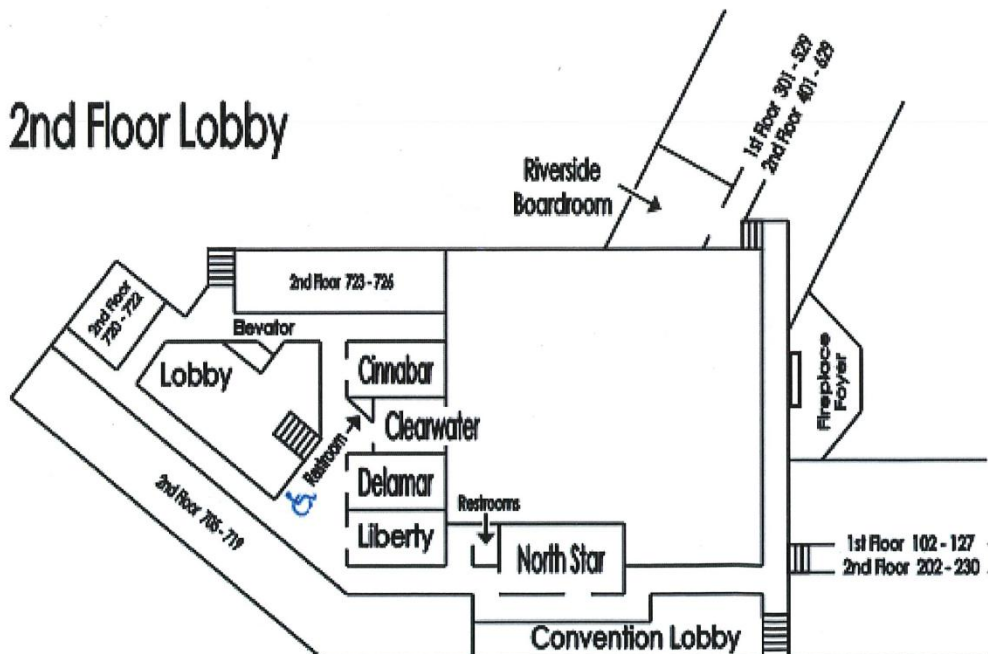

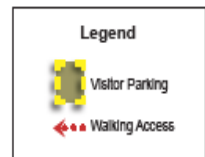


2nd Floor Lobby
